Well at last it's here! 2007, the start of our centenary year. Plans for the District Centenary Camp are well underway, the support and encouragement shown by the leaders is inspiring.

Each District, led by a band, will parade through the town and assemble at Maumbury Rings for the service. Please encourage everyone to attend as it could be the biggest parade Dorset has ever seen, a truly historic event.

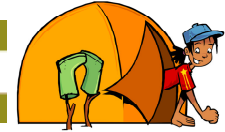

Gone Home "Rocket Ron" (1923 – 2006)

Some of you may well remember Ron Panton, ex GSL 1st Shaftesbury and District President. Sadly, Ron passed away in December. Like a true scout Ron was prepared and had planned his memorial service. He stipulated it was to be a colourful (no black ties), happy event.

When Ron came to Shaftesbury both he and his wife Eileen soon got involved with town life. He was a member of the Congregational church and started a youth group, which had a pop band which traveled round the local churches. He became a member of the Art Centre and performed in many a play, both on stage and stage management.

Like Baden-Powell, Ron did not get involved with Scouting until his late forties when he became GSL at Shaftesbury, a role held up to his retirement at 65. He was respected by both young and old, and held no airs or graces, he could talk to all.

His favourite part of Scouting life was camp, very few did he miss whilst GSL and it was at camp he earned his nickname "Rocket". I hasten to say it was not for speed as it was not Ron's way to rush into things. Ron would like to stroll over to the patrol sites and chat with the lads, and comment on the occasional litter and untidiness, to which he earned the title "here comes Ron to give us a Rocket". So much was their respect for him that at one camp he was present with a T shirt which was emblazoned in red "Rocket Ron". This touched him deeply and was always his favourite scouting memento.

In his time in Scouting, Ron gave a lot to the people he met both young and old and in return Scouting did a lot for Ron. In fact his last Scouting appearance was to attend the Shaftesbury Group's AGM in June.

It will be of approximately 2 ½ hours duration and attendance at the course counts towards ongoing learning. The course is for any adult in scouting with an interest to attend especially those working in any capacity with Young Leaders either as a sponsoring Section Leader or within the Explorer Scout Section. It is intended that the course will cover appropriate subject areas and will provide a forum for discussion and sharing of both good practice and problem sharing. Dorset, along with other Counties, has 2 places for 2 PL's to join other invited Scouts representing Scouting around the world for this unique occasion.

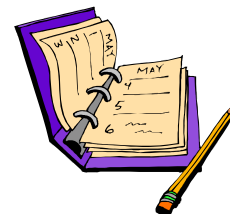
North Dorset can nominate 1 Scout (must be a Patrol Leader) to County for County to make a final countywide selection of 2.PL's.
