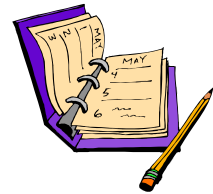

Scout & Explorer Scout Kit Loan Scheme ~

Hi there, I'm Vicky, a member of the Fellowship who helps out with the Orca Explorer pod when I can.

I am currently trying to set up a Scout Kit Loan (SKL), with some help from others. The SKL will be where anybody without the correct kit and equipment for an activity can loan kit from a central base. This has come about from the influx of new members to the movement in the older sections, that have not tried the activities before and do not want to, or are unable to, own the kit that is required at this level.

If you have children then you will know that they grow out of kit (or lose it!) and having to replace it can sometimes be tight, in terms of both time and money, this is our way of being able to help out.

For the time being SKL will be limited to the Scout and Explorer (inc. Young Leaders) sections, to test the waters as such. If SKL becomes popular and utilised then we can think about expanding to some of the younger sections. So, if you have kit that is useable, that you, or anybody you know has grown out of, replaced with something new or that you no longer require then can you please let us know! In particular we are looking for waterproofs, walking boots and camping equipment, however we won't turn anything down, all we ask is that the kit can still be used, and preferably clean!
